Practicum: Introduction to Project Management

Course Credit: 3 Semester Hours

I. Course Description

The Associate's program requires each student to complete four directed projects (one in each module) as a requirement for completion of the program. These projects help the student utilize their theological learning in an applied setting, ideally the home parish or community. The topic of the project is left to the discretion of the student, with the blessing of the student's priest/pastor, and approval of the professor. It is expected that these projects will give the student an opportunity to learn how to plan, execute, and evaluate the results of projects in their home parish/community. The project must be a new project for the student, meaning it is not currently being performed/executed by the student.

II. At the conclusion of this course, students will be able to:

- A. Understand how to research, propose, plan, execute, and evaluate the results of a project within their home parish or community.
- B. Be more familiar with the project process as preferred by their home priest and parish council.

- C. Grow spiritually by understanding the scripture that “faith apart from works is dead” (James 2:26).
